
DATA FOR DECISION MAKERS

Data for Decision Makers is a regional profile and analysis of the Lake Land College district, with data broken out by county or the 31 public school districts within Lake Land's service area. Developed by the University of Illinois Extension with data drawn from numerous reputable sources, the report highlights some concerning long-term trends for the district such as population decline, increased poverty rates and trailing education levels.


Between 2010 and 2017, the overall college district population declined by 1.1%, while the youth population, those less than 18, declined by 8.8%. While Effingham County saw an increase in overall population, it mirrored the district's decline in youth.

Within the district, the median household income in 2017 was \$13,000 below the state of Illinois median of \$59,196. Only two school districts showed median household income surpassing the state average–Dieterich at \$60,648 and Teutopolis at \$61,679. Considering other Effingham County communities, the median income in Altamont was \$53,684; in Beecher City-\$52,806; and in Effingham-\$50,294.


POPULATION DECLINE Effingham County

Poverty is endemic throughout the district, with 25 of the 31 public school districts in Lake Land's service area having a population of low-income students exceeding 40%, including several in Effingham County. Low-income students include those who live in households that receive SNAP, TANF, are classified as homeless, or are eligible for free or reduced lunch programs.

In regards to overall poverty rates, Effingham County is at 10.9% poverty, with the rate for those under age 18 at 15%. For comparison, Cook County's overall poverty rate is 16.7%, while the rate for those under age 18 is 24.2%. Several neighboring counties to Effingham closely mirror the Cook County rates.

As a district, the educational attainment of adults rests below the state average of 40%. With fewer than a third of district residents having an associate degree or higher, it may mean the regional workforce is not well prepared for the changing world of work that requires increasingly complex levels of training.

According to this analysis, we will need these trained and educated employees to keep up with demand. The labor market in our area is projected to grow 2.6% between 2014 and 2024.

By sharing this pertinent demographic and economic data with our community, business and education partners, Lake Land College hopes to spur new conversation with area leaders as we collaborate to enhance the educational opportunities available for our residents and the overall welfare of our communities.

Developing Tomorrow's Workforce...Today

Effingham County has been blessed with a growing economy for many years. This growth represents both opportunities and challenges alike. One of the primary challenges is ensuring that Effingham County has the workforce talent to keep up with the demand for skilled employees. As businesses grow in this area, so does the need for skilled talent to run them.

Effingham County Chamber Commerce is working in conjunction with local businesses and educators to cultivate and enhance the skills that employers want. A successful result of the efforts will be to educate students and working adults on the existence of, and garner interest in, local career opportunities while also preparing them with the necessary skills needed to occupy these positions. This not only benefits the individuals and employers but the success and growth of the businesses undeniably helps bolster the continued progress and prosperity of Effingham County and the communities that lie within our borders.

It all begins with communication.

Engaging with our young people in conversation about our community and learning their views and the best ways to communicate with this age group has led to positive interaction and action steps we can build upon to keep our young people interested in our community and job opportunities. Thanks to Joe Fatheree and Charlie Huber at Effingham High School's Innovation class, these conversations have begun.

In Fall 2019, several Chamber members participated in a focus group with students of this class to discuss their perspectives as they relate to opportunities available to them here in Effingham County and their plans after graduation. The information captured through this session was essential. Even in this small sample, challenges were confirmed and largely centered on the students' awareness of local programs and career opportunities. The key is not only to have these programs available, but to find ways to effectively communicate these opportunities to the students.

We will continue these conversations with more students from all Effingham County High Schools in the near future. (NOTE: With the recent mandatory closing of local schools, some activities have been delayed).

Given the large percentage of available jobs in the manufacturing and distribution locally, **Effingham County Manufacturing Day** was adopted in 2013 to provide an opportunity to make accurate and timely information available about the opportunities in this industry. Shifting to a more direct and interactive approach with the students, this annual event emphasizes manufacturers'

need for people with technical, marketing, sales, accounting and many varied positions.

Class, job/career fairs, Construction Trades Education Curriculum, Health Occupations curriculum, welding classes and other career and technical training courses are in place at the high school level. For those entering or returning to college, there are specialized programs at Lake Land College through their High Demand Program to get students trained and ready for employment at a lower cost with less time commitment.

The Workforce Readiness Committee of the Effingham Regional Career Academy circulated a survey to area businesses in early 2020 to learn of the existence of and interest in Internships and apprenticeships. The goal is to offer support to companies that have these programs already in place, while also assisting those that don't in installing such programs.

The Chamber's Workforce Development Division goals include supporting individuals in developing the job skills and work habits necessary to be work ready, assisting employers with their recruitment and retention efforts and collaborating with local and regional partners on issues that affect talent attraction. We have developed partnerships with the Illinois Chamber of Commerce, Dale Carnegie Training, IMEC and others to provide essential employer and employee training programs in a variety of formats.



We believe that these combined efforts and the collaboration of the community, educators, and community leaders will ultimately result in a larger pool of qualified, trained and dedicated talent for the growing need in





Siemer Milling Company recently opened a new 7 story Bulk Flour Storage Facility at their Teutopolis mill, completing one of its biggest plant and equipment investments in 2019. The \$17 million expansion increases total flour storage capacity by 375% from 800,000 to 3,000,000 lbs, allowing for storage of 3 days' worth of production, as opposed to the previous single day capacity. The new facility makes handling finished flour much more efficient and helps to ensure safe and sanitary conditions.
