

Maintaining Healthy Joints in the Workplace

Just as a wooden bench is made more comfortable with a fluffy cushion, joint health is largely dependent on cartilage.

The "cushion" in our joints is called articular cartilage, and the loss of it leads to the development of osteoarthritis. Osteoarthritis is the most common form of arthritis, affecting millions of people.

Whether your job requires repetitive motion or sitting at a desk all day, here are five ways to keep your joints healthy so you feel your best at work and at home.

Manage your weight. Keeping a proper body weight for your frame is probably the most important thing you can do for the long-term health of your joints. For example, in climbing a stair, the pressure between the back of the kneecap and front of the thigh bone reaches 10-12 times your body weight.

Exercise. Strive for at least 30 minutes of low impact exercise a day. Swimming, cycling, water aerobics, elliptical machine or walking are all easy on the joints. Try taking a walk on your lunch break.

Examine your diet. Reduce foods that are known to cause inflammation. For example, those donuts in the break room probably contain bleached flour and sugar, two ingredients that can increase inflammation. Focus on anti-inflammatory foods instead, such as salmon, beans, lentils, broccoli, cabbage, and brightly colored fruit.

Consider supplements. Probably the best-known supplement to promote healthy cartilage is glucosamine chondroitin sulfate. The addition of ASU to glucosamine chondroitin can add anti-inflammatory properties as well. Daily doses of 2,000 IU of vitamin D and 1000-1500 mg of calcium can also help maintain bone health, reduce the risk of osteoporosis and fragility fractures.

Talk to your doctor. If you suffer from joint pain, ask your doctor about possible medications, physical therapy, joint injections and surgery options.

57/70 Task Force Fights Human Trafficking

Human trafficking is an often-invisible issue, and a local group of citizens believes people in the Effingham area are uniquely situated to help spot, report, and rescue victims of human trafficking. The 57/70 Task Force is a newly established group of individuals working through The Chamber Foundation of Effingham County to "Educate the community to eliminate human trafficking in Effingham County, one person at a time."



Human trafficking involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to obtain some type of labor or commercial sex act and affects millions of men, women, and children every year. It can happen in any community and victims can be any age, race, gender, or nationality. Language barriers, fear of their traffickers, and/or fear of law enforcement frequently keep victims from seeking help.

making human trafficking a hidden crime.

The task force is already reaching out via many avenues to fulfill their mission. They have hosted a series of informational roundtables to share the perspective and knowledge of the Effingham City Police Department and several related nonprofits. They have also set up awareness-building billboards in our area. The group's Facebook page amplifies local and online events and resources that will help people educate themselves on the issue and help them to



prevent or to report suspected trafficking, with a website coming at the end of the month.

57/70 Task Force has been actively working with local agencies like CASA (Court-Appointed Special Advocate), SAFE (Stop Abuse for Everyone), Eden's Glory, SWAN (Stopping Woman Abuse Now), Effingham City Police Department, and Effingham Social Justice Group.

The 57/70 Task Force is actively seeking donors to support this cause, and money raised so far has gone to marketing, web design, education, and billboards in our area to raise awareness. The group thanks several donors who have stepped up to help spread awareness of this important issue.

dent. He is currently planning the rollout of the EC-JOBS program, scheduled for July 1, 2021.




Community Support

the EDUCATION issue

Students in Effingham County benefit from the collaborative efforts of the school system and the business community. Coming together to provide opportunities for students have resulted in partnerships that return dividends now and into the future.

Programs like CEO, CTEC and health occupations, that have their roots in Effingham County, give students a leg up on their futures by giving them the chance to "test drive" aspects of their career choice and make informed choices. Joining forces helps us maximize the resources available to school students and key in on the development needs of our incumbent workers by creating pathways to sustainable employment.

Collaborative efforts are also important ways to address other education concerns as schools face teacher shortages and funding issues. Additionally, businesses have looked to the school system to help address training needs of their employees. With the help of business investment, Effingham County has been able to deliver manufacturing skills and welding classes available to students and incumbent workers.



The largest collaborative effort in Effingham County is the Effingham Regional Career Academy.

A board that contains business leaders and educators is charged with developing a curriculum that prepares students for a career in one of five curriculum areas in highest demand in Effingham County: Advanced Manufacturing, Health Care, Agriculture, Information Technology and Automotive/Transportation.



ERCA's primary focus will be on stackable certificates that serve as building blocks toward a post-secondary degree or certificate. These stackable credentials not only allow traditional students a starting point for their careers but also serve as a professional development opportunity to upskill the current workforce. This allows students the option of earning a certificate and heading directly into the workforce after high school graduation, go back to school later to earn an associates degree and still later to pursue a four-year degree.

The career academy has attracted the interest of area school districts, with 14 signing intergovernmental agreements for the opportunity

The ERCA is designed to teach the skills and knowledge needed in both the current and future job markets. The mission is to attract, retain and grow area businesses by providing an innovative learning environment which provides hands on experiences and training to both students and incumbent adult workers.

to give students opportunities for success. Plans are to accommodate 150 students annually at the career academy along with providing upskilling opportunities for incumbent workers.

The ERCA will be housed in a new building to be constructed south of the Kluthe Center for Higher Education & Technology in Effingham. The 40,000 square foot facility will house two training labs and multiple classrooms with the flexibility to transition to new learning needs as they are identified.

The current construction timeline would have ERCA classes beginning in the 2023-2024 school year. The timeline could shorten pending available funding. A fundraising campaign will begin later this year for classroom infrastructure and equipment needs.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

DIETERICH

The Village of Dieterich has been awarded \$2,014,800 for the Dieterich Community Recreation Center through the State's Park and Recreational Facility Construction Act (PARC) grant program.

Work is also underway on the expansion of the park pavilion and a handicapped accessible fishing pier.





EFFINGHAM

Quik Trip will construct a new facility at 1320 North Third, the northeast corner of North Route 45 and Technology Drive.



A new 25,000 square foot building is under construction on North Route 45 for *I70 Truck Center, Inc.* The truck center provides heavy duty installation and repair for service fleet and commercial tractor trailers along with an inventory of quality replacement parts. The company is also certified for annual DOT tractor trailer inspections. Owners Chris and Sharon Roepke and their staff of 17 are hoping to expand their team of experienced mechanics.



Bike Trail Improvement Project Moving Forward

The Effingham City Council has approved a local agreement for Federal participation with IDOT and committed local funds to make Effingham more "bike friendly". Utilizing over \$900,000 in federal grant funds, the City is preparing for improvements on several routes through the city that include striping, signage and kiosks. Trailheads will be added along Ford Avenue and on Keller Drive. The city's share of the project is 20% of the project cost. Half of the city's costs will be provided by TREC (Trails Recreation Effingham County). The project is on the Illinois Department of Transportation's June bid letting calendar.



CEFS Head Start Program is moving to the old Library building on Market Street. The move will allow the organization to expand and bring the main program for 3 to 5 year olds and the Early Head Start serving younger children, under one roof. CEFS received approval to spend up to \$50,000 of tax increment finance dollars through the City of Effingham for the building renovation. The building will be completely solar-powered through funding made available through Illinois Solar for All. Plans are for the move to the new building to take place in May, with programming to begin in late summer and early fall.

Joe's Pizza and Pasta has entered the frozen pizza business, Joe's Froze. After two years of formulating the new product line, Joe's Froze are available in about 15 grocery stores throughout the state, at the Joe's Pizza restaurants and at local bars. Manufacturing began in June 2020. Currently eight varieties are offered along with a breakfast pizza.

ALTAMONT



A multimillion dollar expansion of *The Equity* is underway in Altamont. An existing building has been demolished to make room for a $40' \times 80'$ office building with an $80' \times 120'$ attached shop, an $80' \times 100'$ chemical building, and $80' \times 232'$ warehouse for chemicals and seed. The Altamont Equity location employs 21 full time employees and adds up to 15 part-time seasonal workers.






