Community Strong is the theme of this issue of Network Magazine. And, nothing makes our community stronger than when we support each other. COVID-19 has brought us together in different ways and we have found ways to adjust what we do to help us get through the past few months.

The past few months have brought challenges we never thought we would face. We have learned a new vocabulary: social distancing, shelter-in-place, PPE.....We have learned new ways to keep our businesses operating, help our employees, serve our customers and care about our community.

Through it all, the Chamber has been researching the most current and accurate information as your trusted source of information. We have adjusted our programming to a virtual environment and are working to boost consumer confidence.

COVID-19 Resource Page on the Chamber website at *EffinghamCountyChamber.com* has kept businesses updated on the latest news and resources. It is the most visited page on our website right now.

Local Link is a new email program being delivered to homes throughout Effingham County.

Weekly Webinars bring topics of interest to businesses, from grant and loan programs to employer/employee issues and discussions on reopening your business. We plan to continue the webinars through the summer months, for now.

Support for Small Business Grant Program was created by the Chamber Foundation of Effingham County to support small businesses, many of whom have had to close their doors during the shelter-in-

place order. Grants will be made as long as funds are available.

As our thoughts turn to reopening our businesses and rebuilding our economy, we want to share a few stories of how some of our local businesses have found new ways to be productive.



A Peoria hospital in search of PPE (masks, gloves, surgical gowns and ventilators) found their way to *Bierman Welding* in Effingham by way of a former Effingham resident. As a result, Bierman's was able to fill an order for 20,000 face shields.

Former Dieterich resident Tyler Budde is an engineer for Advanced Technology Services Inc. Budde took the call from the hospital, designed the face shield that could be used by doctors, nurses and anyone typically seeing a patient and then contacted Mark Bierman at Bierman Welding for assistance in cutting the plastic face shields.

This was a new venture for Bierman, but they took it on willingly and were able to produce the masks in two days using a water jet machine. Employees at Bierman Welding put in 32 hours on the project -- working long hours to get the job done. The shields went back to the ATS plant for finishing and delivery to the hospital.¹

Stevens Industries, Inc., the largest commercial cabinet company in North America, is used to serving hospitals and schools in 35 states. The company recently took time to manufacture and donate an important tool to help keep staff at HSHS St.



Anthony's Memorial Hospital safe – an intubation box.

Intubation – inserting a breathing tube into a patient's throat to ease breathing – is done when a patient needs assistance breathing. What is normally a routine procedure is now complicated by the fact that the clinician doesn't know if the patient they are helping is sick with the coronavirus. Intubation boxes – like the one created by Stevens Industries – add a level of protection for the provider as they are intubating the patient.

The three-sided, clear acrylic plastic intubation box covers a sedated patient's head and upper body. Two holes allow the clinician to put their hands in to intubate the patient while the top of the clear box helps providers avoid direct contact or proximity with the patient. The box can also be cleaned and disinfected.

Stevens Industries President Todd Wegman shared how the creation and donation of the intubation box came about. "I was approached by a hospital facilities director from Tampa, FL who had photos of these boxes and inquired whether we could possibly manufacture them," he said. "Seeing how local hospitals could benefit from them, I shared the idea with my team and they set out to create and produce some. We are happy to help our local hospital provide critical care safely."²



As a small business owner in downtown Effingham, Sara Ruholl was forced to shut down her business, *The Beanstalk Boutique*, as it was deemed a nonessential business. So Sara began making face masks.

She set up an assembly line with family and friends

helping, even her 7-year old daughter and worked many long hours to produce hundreds of masks daily. She's already made thousands of masks, donating several hundred to health care workers and the crisis nursery. Masks are also available for sale.

A 28-year-old wife and mother of two, Sara purchased an existing business and relocated to downtown Effingham, and rebranded it as The Beanstalk Boutique in 2019. Beanstalk Boutique is located at 314 W. Jeffferson.

"When life gives you lemons, you make lemonade. When life gives you a pandemic, you learn to make face masks to help your small business to survive and to give back to the community," says Sara.



Twilight Distillery, located on the same property as Vahling Vineyards near Stewardson, started making brandy last year. When the need for hand sanitizer was in short supply, the distillery was contacted by Crossroads Cancer Center and Lightning Strike hand sanitizer was created.

The distillery was able to make the switch thanks to a recent ruling by the Illinois Department of Revenue (IDOR), which allows them permission to use their distillery in this way and to claim a tax deduction on their alcohol purchases to remove any tax liability. Their waiver is available until June 30. They anticipate making 8,000 bottles of hand sanitizer

D-LICIOUS - Like most entrepreneurs, 13-year old Dakota Flaig had a need to make money and found a way to fulfill it, and started a business in the process.

When the Pandemic hit and schools were closed, Dakota, the 13-year-old son of Tara Higgs and

James Flaig, wanted to purchase a gaming system for entertainment and was told he needed to earn the money to purchase it. And, as with most start-up businesses, the first attempt wasn't successful.

Working with his mother, the decision was made to find a product that was not readily available in the local market. Then, relying on his family's experiences, he obtained a recipe for Whoopie Pies from his grandmother. The original recipe contains chocolate cake-like cookies with a marshmallow filling, which are known as Effing Original. Dakota has branched out into flavors like Key Lime Heaven,

Choco Nut and Red Moon. A special Brave Heart flavor was introduced for Memorial Day.

Dakota is helped by his mother and twin brother, Noah, but does 90% of the work himself. Facebook page accepts orders and then lets customers know when orders are ready. In the first 48 hours, 36 dozen were ordered.








EIU Innovation Network


