LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

In this Issue: We are closing in on Election Day 2020. And, we all know it's a big one from the national, state and local levels. Locally we will see a slight change on the Effingham County Board and our representation in Springfield will see at least two new legislators representing Effingham County. Illinois voters are being asked to vote on a Constitutional Amendment that will change how Illinois residents are taxed on their income.

The Chamber Board of Directors has reviewed this issue and is opposed to the Amendment for reasons that include the timing of this change in a year when Illinois residents are already hurting from the pandemic and resulting economic conditions. We oppose giving new powers to a state legislature that is mired in ethical challenges and eliminating the protection of only one tax on incomes. The anticipated additional taxes raised will not begin to cover the amount needed to dent the state's budget deficit. And, finally, changes to the tax structure will be another hit to the growing out migration of prime working age and educated Illinoisans

Illinois' fiscal policy and tax laws should actively promote economic growth by encouraging increased capital investment, productivity, and creation of new jobs for its citizens, not create an environment that punishes citizens who want to improve their lives and grow their incomes.



EFFINGHAM COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

The Equity Purchases 23 Acres at Mid America Motorworks.

The Equity and Mid America Motorworks have announced the purchase of the Mid America corporate office building and 23 acres of ground at Mid America Motorworks' location along North Route 45.

The Equity ran out of space at their Roadway Avenue location and will use the new space for its Corporate functions and the Agronomy business unit, including demonstration plots and educational events. Business operations along with the Grain, Feed and Energy divisions will remain on Roadway Avenue. The Equity is the largest independent agricultural cooperative in Illinois. The organization offers a broad range of products to fulfill customers' needs, including Agronomy, Grain Services, Feed & Livestock, Energy, and a Hardware Do It Center.

Mike Yager, CEO of Mid America Motorworks stated that "we are pleased to welcome The Equity to 23 acres of the Corporate Campus situated north of Effingham." Mid America Motorworks carpet operations and interior manufacturing division, known as Performance Choice, have been moved to Alabama and Texas, which allow the full aftermarket Corvette and Air-Cooled VW company to move its daily operations into the Performance Choice Office building.

Located behind the 1910 Gas Station, the move to completely renovated offices also allows for the connection of the MY Garage Museum and Mid America Motorworks' Retail Operations with the addition of a breezeway. The Corporate Campus will remain set up and operational for events, with the iconic Fun Dome, and Install Domes, along with the Funfest Amphitheater on the northeast 90 acres of the property.

Yager noted that the move is a huge positive for Mid America Motorworks, as it allows the company to streamline several aspects of operations and retain all staff and have even added to their team.

State Renews Altamont/Beecher City Enterprise Zone

The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity has renewed the Enterprise Zone that includes much of Effingham County.

Enterprise Zones are an economic development tool used to encourage job growth and investment in economically underserved communities. Companies and organizations within a zone may qualify for various tax incentives, including sales tax exemptions for qualifying building materials, investment tax credits, utility tax exemptions or various local incentives

Once designated, an Enterprise Zone maintains its designation for 15 years. The zone approved includes much of Altamont as well as an extension north along Illinois Route 128 to and including parts of Beecher City.

Continental Mills Expanding in Effingham



Continental Mills, Inc., the maker of premium baking, breakfast and snack brands, has purchased the former Hodgson Mill plant located adjacent to its existing manufacturing plant in Effingham, providing the company the capacity it needs to support continued growth.

The 175,000 square foot renovated facility, is expected to be up and running sometime in 2021. In addition to providing increased capacity, the Effingham facility offers excellent proximity to Continental Mills' customers in the Eastern U.S., Midwest and Southeast.

Company Senior Vice President of Operations Mike Meredith said Effingham was a natural choice for the company's next expansion. "We already have a great partnership with the Effingham community and, as a family-owned business, those relationships are very important to us," Meredith said. "We have a tremendous amount of confidence in our team in Effingham, as well as employees across Continental Mills who will prepare this plant to open next year."

EFFINGHAM COUNTY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Continental Mills has been in Effingham since 2014, when it acquired the 190,000-square-foot manufacturing facility built by Krispy Kreme Doughnuts Corp. in 2001. The Effingham manufacturing plant focuses on production of large quantity dry-mix products.

Effingham Veterinary Clinic Ready to Expand



Effingham Veterinary Clinic Growing and An Expansion Was Inevitable

Owners, Dale Spindler, James Gratz and S. Chad Ely, broke ground on an expansion of their 408 Keller Drive location on August 20. The 4,000 square foot expansion will include an additional exam room, treatment area, expanded ICU rooms for small animals, as well as a cat only waiting area. For large animal services, the addition allows for expanded overnight stabling for hospitalization and extended space for equine surgery. Additional parking is also part of the expansion. Grooming services will be added in the future.

The clinic has also hired additional staff and expanded the treatment and exam areas to provide more efficient service for their clients. Dr. Katie Shreve recently joined the clinic and Dr. Jessie McKinney was welcomed back.

Effingham Veterinary Clinic was founded in 1973 by Dr. Sauers. Dr. Spindler became his partner in 1988. Dr. Gratz and Dr. Ely joined as partners after Dr. Sauers retirement. There are currently have 5 associate veterinarians - Dr. Mara Fehrenbacher, Dr. Lindsay Goeckner, Dr. Tanner Kirby, Dr. Jessie McKinney and Dr. Katie Shreve. This team of 8 veterinarians have a combined 100 years experience. With the purchase of Newton Veterinary Clinic in 2012, they have been able to offer the same excellent care to Jasper County as well

Altamont Opens Solar Plant



City officials in Altamont recently celebrated the completion of their newly installed solar panel array which produces a maximum capacity of 500 kW and is made up of 1,674 solar panels.

The solar plant is a project of the Illinois Municipal Electric Agency, which supplies wholesale power to Altamont. As a demonstration site, the plant will supplement electric capacity by enough to supply approximately 100 Altamont residential electric customers.

The power plant began commercial operation on August 26.

CHAMBERS AGAINST THE PROGRESSIVE TAX AMENDMENT

The Effingham County Chamber of Commerce has joined a coalition of state organizations and local chambers in opposition to a proposed change to the Illinois Constitution that would change the way Illinois residents' income is taxed.

Illinois currently has a flat income tax rate as mandated by the Constitution. Everyone pays a tax on their income at the same rate (currently 4.95%) and corporations pay the same tax rate (currently 7%). The current rate protects taxpayers by allowing the state to levy only one tax based on income.

The Constitutional amendment proposes to eliminate this taxpayer protection and opens the door to multiple tax rates on multiple types of income. Rates will be set by statute, not by the Constitution, and there are no requirements on how the tax income can be spent.

Proponents of the Constitutional Amendment claim the revised tax structure would lower the tax rate on middle and lower incomes and raise taxes on higher income wage earners. Estimates are that the revised tax structure would bring in an estimated \$3.6 billion in new revenue to the state.

The Amendment gives the Legislature power to increase taxes on any group of taxpayers with no limits and no accountability and without any requirement to use the additional revenue to fund essential needs such as healthcare, education or public safety.*

The Effingham County Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors has studied the issue and has voted in opposition to the Constitutional Amendment.

POSITION STATEMENT PROGRESSIVE INCOME TAX BALLOT INITIATIVE

"The Board of Directors of the Effingham County Chamber of Commerce, which represents 550 regional businesses and their 15,000 employees, opposes the proposed amendment to the Illinois Constitution that will allow a new progressive tax structure on the grounds that such an amendment harms businesses of all types and sizes; will cost Illinois jobs, hurt workers, and allows the Legislature to raise taxes on all levels of income without limit. The proposed change leaves the door open for more than one tax on income and types of income. The increase in revenue is not tied to any type of spending cuts, providing an open checkbook for a legislature that already has ethical challenges."

The Chamber's mission is to strengthen member business and stimulate regional prosperity. This amendment does neither.

The Chamber Board's concerns of the proposed tax increase amendment include:

- Timing of the proposed amendment in light of the current economic conditions resulting from the prolonged impacts of COVID-19.
- Small businesses and individuals have been especially hard hit this year. While the amendment promises lower taxes for smaller incomes, the amendment removes any restrictions on rates.
- Small businesses account for an ever-increasing percentage of business income and employment in Illinois and frequently operate as sole proprietors or through some form of tax pass-through entity (partnerships, Sub-S Corps, or as an LLP/LLC). As such, small business owners pay individual income tax on their business income, rather than corporate tax. Increasing tax rates on small businesses leaves less available revenue for economic expansion such as hiring additional employees or making capital investments.
- Under the proposal, corporate income would be taxed at flat rate of 10.49%, the third-highest rate in the nation, while the highest bracket for pass-through business income would be taxed at 9.49%, the fourth highest in the nation.

Illinois is already in the lowest ranks of Worst States

for Taxes in the U.S. The tax increase would rank Illinois as #3 in highest Corporate Tax Rate and #4 in Pass -Through Entity Tax Rate in the U.S. Illinois already has the second highest property taxes nationally. Illinois' average sales tax statewide is 8.78% compared to the national average of 6.99%

• While Illinois is discussing increasing Income Tax Rates, our neighboring states have been lowering their tax rates (IN dropped from 3.4% to 3.23%, MO dropped from 5.9% to 5.5%, lowa plans to decrease to 6.5%, and KY recently changed from a progressive tax system down to a flat rate of 5%).

2. Increased Power & Trust in the General Assembly

- The proposed amendment to increase taxes also introduces new powers to the General Assembly which more easily allows taking away of credits & incentives depending on an Individual's tax bracket, and makes it easier for the State to begin taxing Retirement Pensions & Social Security income.
- There is no Cap on future increases and tax brackets.
- The Legislature has already approved an 8-tax Bracket plan for Illinoisans (instead of 1, which is simpler to understand & plan). The plan can be changed at any time by the legislature.
- The projected increased revenue (estimated at \$3.6 billion), doesn't address the state's growing Pension issue (which at is close to 1/3 of the State's \$40 Billion FY19/20 Budget).

3. Outmigration of Illinois residents

- Illinois lost more than 850,000 residents to other states during the past decade, causing the state's population to shrink for six consecutive years and suffer the largest raw decline of any state in the 2010s.
- Since 2010 Illinois has lost prime working-age individuals of every race and ethnicity to other states on net.
- The largest group leaving were prime workingage residents, which erodes the state's future.

4. Will lower income residents see a Tax Savings?

- Here are 3 Examples of Proposed Tax impact, which doesn't appear to save current Taxpayers much (at the expense of driving out higher income earners & businesses that are likely creating & providing the Jobs in IL):
- Single Individual \$40k/yr: \$20 less tax annually (~\$0.75 bi-weekly paycheck), based on proposed 4.75%

rate vs. current 4.95% flat rate.

- Married Couple \$80k/yr: \$40 of less tax annually (-\$1.50 bi-weekly paycheck), based on proposed 4.90% vs. current 4.95% flat rate.
- Married Couple \$280k/yr: \$700 of more tax annually (-\$30 less on bi-weekly paycheck), based on proposed 7.75% vs. current 4.95% flat rate.

Illinois fiscal policy and tax laws should actively promote economic growth in Illinois by encouraging increased capital investment, productivity, and the creation of new jobs for the citizens of Illinois.

A graduated or progressive income tax can create a very real dis-incentive to work as it punishes, through higher tax rates, those who choose to work more hours or longer days.

Question that appears on the ballot:

"The proposed amendment grants the State authority to impose higher income tax rates on higher income levels, which is how the federal government and a majority of other states do it. The amendment would remove the portion of the Revenue Article of the Illinois Constitutions that is sometimes referred to as the "flat tax," that requires all taxes on income to be at the same rate. The amendment does not itself change tax rates. It gives the State ability to impose higher rates on those with higher income levels and lower income levels. You are asked to decide whether the proposed amendment should become part of the Illinois Constitution."

In 2017, the Illinois General Assembly passed an Income tax hike that increased personal income tax by 32% and 33% for corporations, raising Illinois' total tax burden to at least 6th highest from the 10th highest. More than \$1.2 billion went to pensions and debt.

Personal income tax rose from 3.75% to 4.95% and the corporate tax rate rose from 5.25 to 7%.

The actual Constitutional Amendment language:

The measure would amend Section 3 of Article IX of the Illinois Constitution. The following <u>underlined</u> text would be added and struck-through text would be deleted:

Section 3. Limitations on Income Taxation.

(a) A tax on or measured by income shall be at a non-graduated rate. At any one time there may be no more than one such tax imposed by the State for State purposes on individuals and one such tax so imposed on corporations. The General Assembly shall provide by law for the rate or rates of any tax on or measured by income imposed by the State. In any such tax imposed upon corporations the highest rate shall not exceed the highest rate imposed on individuals by more than a ratio of 8 to 5.






