Every local organization and effort to make Effingham County a greater place to live and work needs people to make their efforts successful. A major initiative this year is a Just Show Up! Campaign is to create programming and messaging around the importance of community involvement and its positive impact on businesses and the community by:

- Promoting local volunteer opportunities
- Connecting with K-12 students on the benefits of community engagement
- Hosting quarterly networking events for newcomers to the community
- Investigating the feasibility of offering a Community Leadership Program

In addition, the Community Development team will continue our Shop Local campaign to emphasize the economic impact it has on our community. Other work falls around the Chamber's vision to be the "recognized advocate and regional leader for Chamber members" through our active Legislative Committee with events that connect businesses with elected officials at all levels of government.



WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Division Goal: To assist area employers in the attraction, development and training of a qualified workforce to ensure a stable employment base for the area.

Identifying and supporting individuals to have the job skills and work habits necessary to be work ready employees is one of four main goals of the Chamber's

workforce development initiatives for 2019. Programs will be targeted to high school and college students as well as incumbent workers for both training and work-based learning opportunities.

At the same time, we will be assisting employers with their recruitment and retention efforts utilizing technology to provide needed resources and connections, hosting events like the Effingham County Job Fair and Effingham County Manufacturing Day and collaborating with local partners on issues that affect talent attraction.

Our leadership of the Effingham Regional Career Academy continues to push that initiative forward with a 2023 timeline for completion of the Rural Development & Technology Center at Lake Land College's Kluthe Center campus in Effingham which will house the ERCA.

DEVELOPING A DIGITAL RELATIONSHIP WITH YOUR CUSTOMERS THROUGH YOUR ONLINE PRESENCE

Customers today are searching online for solutions to their problems before they walk in a store or speak to an employee. Information is so readily available that they turn to the internet to ask questions and find answers in the comfort of their own home, or while they are on-the-go. For this reason, it's important for local businesses to build, nurture and grow their online presence. The biggest benefit of cultivating an online presence is to develop a digital relationship with customers online before ever meeting them face to face. A strong digital presence is one of the most important investments a business can make today.

What does it mean to have a digital presence? A digital presence is how easily people find your business online, AND what they find online about you. It includes content and messaging that you control, such as the information on your website and social media profiles, etc.) as well as content that you do not control, including reviews and service ratings.

Having a strong digital presence helps a business make a positive "digital first impression". A digital relationship begins when customers take in all of the information they find out about you. Your digital first impression needs to be engaging and on-point to capture the customer's attention because there are so many options to choose from. And, because there are so many options, it is important that your business is able to be found in as many places as possible.

Below are some tips on how you can create a strong digital presence and foster a positive digital relationship with customers online.

WEBSITES

Have a Mobile Friendly Website - Over half of all website traffic is from mobile devices. Ensuring that your website is easy to use and still visually engaging on a mobile device is very important. Additionally, search engines will give placement preference to websites that are mobile-friendly.



Optimize For Keywords - The famous line from the movie, Field of Dreams, "If you build it, they will come" is NOT true with websites. Just because you have a website, doesn't mean you will automatically appear when a customer tries to find you on a search engine. The site must be optimized with keywords and content that are relevant to the search. To help your site be found in searches, first understand what you want to be "Googled for" and optimize your pages accordingly.

Utilize Engaging Images and Content - Research tells us that website visitors form an opinion about your business within .05 seconds of opening your website. They will leave within 10 seconds if not engaged or drawn in. What does this mean? Your website needs to be pretty and kept up-to-date.

SOCIAL MEDIA SITES

Find Your Place: Facebook, Instagram, Linkedin, YouTube, etc. - Not all social media sites work for all businesses. Know your audience and select the platform(s) that make the most sense for your audience and your product.



Utilize Engaging Images and Content - With the billions of users on social media today, they often will check out a business on social media before they visit the company's website. Ensure your business information is up-to-date (hours, etc.) and you are posting with relative frequency to convey that you are active on that platform.

Be Responsive - Long gone are the days of picking up the phone and calling a business with questions. Customers of all ages are choosing convenience of social media platforms as a means to interact with businesses. It is important to be available and responsive when answering direct messages and responding to comments or reviews. The level of engagement utilizing these tools is a strong indicator to the consumer about the level of service they can expect. This is an important piece in establishing a strong digital relationship.

DIRECTORY AND LOCATION LISTINGS

Take Advantage of Free Listings - Online directory listings can often make all the difference if your business or location appears in a local

search "near me". The top business directory sites that offer free listings include Google My Business, Yelp, Foursquare, and Bing Maps. There are hundreds of online directories available, and by utilizing those resources, you can dramatically improve the online presence of your business.

ONLINE REVIEWS

Leverage Customer Testimonials - Online reviews are HUGE. As customers review the information

that you have shared with them on your website and social media pages, they are also wanting to find out what others have to sav. The more authentic reviews you can garner, the more customers are going to be willing to try out your products or services.



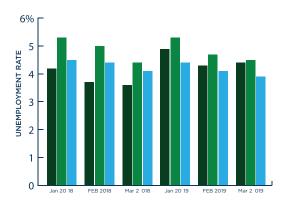
DIGITAL ADVERTISING

Create Top of Mind Awareness - Digital advertising is a fancy way of describing the act of promoting your products with paid advertising online with Google Ads, Facebook or Instagram Ads, PPC, CPM, etc. The benefit of digital advertising is that you can micro-target your customers, and appear in a number of different online locations - such as in search ads, mobile ads, apps, social media and more.

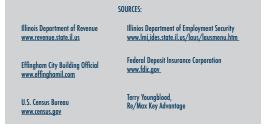

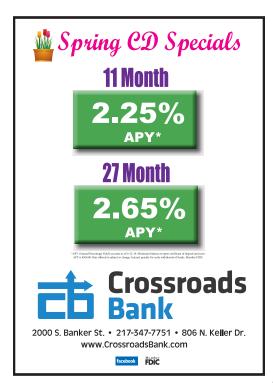
