The First Friday Luncheon in December was focused on the Economic Development of Effingham County. We were fortunate to have leaders in their fields present on legislative (Scott Cruz, Officer, Greensfelder), the City of Effingham (Todd Hull, Economic Development Director, City of Effingham), financial (Jay Buehnerkemper, Effingham Community President-Commercial Loan Officer, First Mid Bank & Trust), real estate/housing (Chris Etter, Co-Owner/Agent, RE/MAX Key Advantage), and the Chamber (Lucinda Hart, CAE, MBA, President & CEO, Effingham County Chamber).



CAPITAL INVESTOR SPOTLIGHT



HSHS St. Anthony's Memorial Hospital's Mission is "To reveal and embody Christ's healing love for all people through our high quality Franciscan health care ministry." Its colleagues, leaders and providers are dedicated to living out this Mission so area residents can be assured they are receiving exceptional care close to home.

St. Anthony's continues to lead the way in innovative technology to enhance patient safety and experience. For example, to keep patients even safer, St. Anthony's is piloting fall reduction equipment by VirtuSense[™] called VSTOne which uses infrared sensors as "alarms" instead of traditional bed alarms. VSTOne's artificial intelligence and light detection and ranging sensors work together to not just detect, but predict patient bed and chair exits 35 to 65 seconds before they get up. When a patient attempts to exit their bed, a VSTOne alert is sent immediately to nurses and techs and the system asks the patient to wait so a staff member can help them.

In November, St. Anthony's became the first hospital in the nation and even in North and South America to install and begin using the newly developed Nautilus operating table and x-ray system from Dornier MedTech for urological procedures. This innovative unit gives urologists a high degree of flexibility, increasing patient comfort and enhancing examination quality. With the Nautilus' C-arm and motorized free-standing treatment table, x-ray images can be taken during procedures from different planes without having to reposition the patient. Additionally, the high-resolution imaging from unprecedented positions and angles offers doctors a wider area to x-ray in one image, helping with diagnosis and treatment.

St. Anthony's has been recognized by several national organization for the care they provide.

St. Anthony's earned The Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval® for Advanced Total Hip and Knee Replacement Certification by demonstrating continuous compliance with its performance standards. HSHS St. Anthony's is one of two hospitals in Illinois (the other hospital being located in DeKalb, IL) to have achieved this advanced orthopedic certification. This was the third time St. Anthony's received this advanced certification, first achieving it in 2018.

Additionally, for the 12th year in a row, its Wound Healing Center was named a recipient of the Center of Distinction award by Healogics[®], the nation's largest provider of advanced wound care services. The

Wound Healing Center has won this award every year since it opened in 2010, for outstanding clinical outcomes, patient satisfaction and wound healing rates. Of the over 600 Healogics wound centers, St. Anthony's is one of only five other centers nationwide who have won the award in this many consecutive years.

Supporting the Effingham community collaboratively is crucial in meeting area child care needs. For example, St. Anthony's has been the main supporter of the Crisis Nursery of Effingham County since its beginnings in 2017 to help assure this island of safety is here for families in crisis. Several hospital colleagues volunteer their time to serve on the Crisis Nursery board due to their passion for helping families and children.

Another way St. Anthony's has supported area children this past year was with the launch of the inaugural "Meet Me at the Finish Line" Youth Adaptive Try-athlon in September 2022. The try-athlon was offered to kids up to 15 years old overcoming physical challenges and gave them the opportunity to experience the feelings of selfaccomplishment and joy with the backdrop of cheering friends and family. Seventeen kids participated in swimming, biking and run/ walking events, and over 150 people attended the event as volunteers, cheerleaders, buddies, and family and friends of the athletes.

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EMPLOYEE DEVELOPMENT

2023 is fast approaching and that means that we will soon be thinking about our 2023 Business Goals. To assist the Chamber in strategizing, a membership survey was sent in September to help the Chamber determine how we can help you and your businesses.

At the top of our members' concerns continues to be the workforce, which includes employee recruitment and retention. Keeping that in mind, the goal of this feature article is to share some of the best practices our members are doing to develop their employees-that assists with employee recruitment and retention.

Employee Development is a critical strategy that assists with employee recruitment and retention. Here are a few strategies and personal examples of how our Chamber members have implemented them in their organizations and businesses.

Andrew Johnson - Superintendent, Effingham CUSD #40

For new teachers, we have a new teacher orientation. The new teacher is paired with a trained mentor. NTO is followed up with the trained mentor meeting with the new teacher. Our mentor trainer follows up 1-2 times per month with the mentors to give them reminders, and tips to discuss with the new teachers. An additional half day for new special Ed teachers is provided. Due to our lack of obtaining the number of substitute teachers needed to provide additional professional development throughout the year, we have been forced to cut back on additional professional development. We need more folks to become interested in helping us prepare the generations of students seeking to fill our shoes someday in the near future!

Patty Peterson - Director of Communications, Sarah Bush Lincoln

Sarah Bush Lincoln (SBL) is dedicated to developing employees because we understand that when people are equipped with knowledge and the appropriate tools, they can accomplish more. Below is how SBL nurtures its workforce.

Engaging and attracting top talent while maintaining a culture of excellence is the main priority in providing patient care. To reach these goals, the journey is themed, Excellence Way of Life (EWOL). EWOL began 15 years ago, with six multidisciplinary teams, from all levels of the organization to establish and evolve our processes, policies, learning and development programs that fuel high performance and empower staff to deliver an exceptional patient experience. The Leadership Development Team, specializes in creating / coordinating programs, speakers, training and its annual summit celebration of individual as well as organizational accomplishments.

SBL provides tuition reimbursement annually to all full-time (\$4000) and part-time (\$2000) employees, and it

developed a network of online educational resources to help pave the way to degree achievement from associate degrees to doctoral degrees.

The SBL Academy is a six-session program that is considered a basic leadership program in which any employee may apply. Academy participants are selected by a team of previous Academy graduates. They learn about themselves, how to lead others, communicate, and about the Health system. Three EIU professors are contracted to teach each of the sessions. The Neal Nursing Institute provides nurses with funds for certifications, select conferences and research. It is a way for nurses to further engage in their fields and enhance their skills and knowledge. Scholarships are available through the Health Foundation and the Volunteer Guild and to help employees with the financial burden.

The Health Center offers courses to employees to become certified Nursing Assistants and certified Medical Assistants. For some, this is the first step to furthering their medical careers. Basic Nurse Assistant program (BNA) is available to all employees. SBL partners with Lake Land College to provide the class at the Health Center, and SBL pays for tuition and books. Once employees complete the course and are certified, they are expected to work as a care partner position for at least a year. Basic Nurse Assistant program (BNA) to Certified Medical Assistant program (CMA). This program is available to all care partners. Like the BNA program, SBL partners with Lake Land College to provide this class on campus, and SBL pays for the tuition and books. Individuals that achieve certification are expected to work in the CMA position for a minimum of one year.

Online Leadership Development. Sarah Bush Lincoln provides online leadership development courses. Supervisors and Management Team members have access to Huron/Studor online Leadership Digital Library. This Library provides topics related to accountability, communication, diversity and inclusion, employee engagement and retention, financials and productivity, hiring and onboarding, performance management, and transitioning to leadership. SBL offers more than 165 leadership development classes within its Online Interactive Education (OLIE) platform. These classes are available to all employees. Preceptor training. Select employees are trained to precept new employees within the Health System. This training is available to all, regardless of job title or responsibility. Charge Nurse Training. Nurses that will be leading a shift of other nurses on a patient care floor, are provided with charge nurse training. Unit managers or directors designate potential charge nurses and recommend them for the inhouse training.

Monthly Leadership Development classes. SBL offers two to four traditional classroom-style leadership development classes every month. Any leader can attend the leadership development courses, however, all new leaders are required. Emerging leaders can attend these classes, but must receive permission from their supervisors.

Huron 360 leader assessment. All members of the Management Team receive a 360-degree assessment; the leader's supervisor, two peers, and two subordinates. Once completed, the leader receives a report based on the feedback to help them in their personal leader development plan.

New Leader Orientation. All new leaders meet with select key members of the Management and Administrative Team to ensure leaders understand the requirements and the resources available to them. Leadership is for more than just those who serve in management roles. SBL is always looking for effective ways to grow its workforce. Employees look to their peers for guidance and SBL wants everyone to have the tools to be leaders.

Dr. Austin Cheney - Dean, Lumpkin College of Business and Technology, Eastern Illinois University

In Lumpkin College, one of our leadership d e v e l o p m en t a l activities outside of our Leadership Team attending Live2Lead and having occasional leadership workshops is that we have one or two "book clubs" per year, open to the



entire college, where we choose a individual leadership development or organizational leadership book and discuss each chapter throughout the semester or academic year. There are many significant conversations, and we all learn from each other as well as self-reflecting.

Aroyn Borries - Owner, Lindsay's Prefinishing

Lindsay's Prefinishing is developing the local tradecraft in the painting and finishing industry with an On-The-Job-Training (OJT) program that includes one-on-one mentoring, hands-on experience, and an incremental progression of skills over the two-year program. Prefinishing is a niche service, and because we deal with some of the finest detailed work in construction projects, our finishers require a wide variety of techniques and tools to produce high quality results.

We recently worked with the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to become certified for the VA's OJT program to provide greater opportunities to Veterans. We currently have one employee enrolled in this program who receives monthly benefits through the GI Bill. The program offers incentives to the employee while holding both the employer and employee accountable for developing the skills outlined in the training plan. The mutual accountability of this type of training program helps to engage both parties in the importance of developing the team. Through this program we have seen a higher quality of product, employees who operate with greater independence, and more technically proficient employees who can problemsolve when challenges arise.

As we look forward to the new year, we know that one of the most important areas of our work is developing the next generation of skilled professionals in our trade. We are grateful and thankful to this community for entrusting us with your projects, and we're excited to see what's in store this year.

Ashley Gramann - Communications Manager, Hospital Sisters Health System Illinois

Hospital Sisters Health System (HSHS) offers opportunities for developing our colleagues professionally. Full-time and part-time colleagues are eligible for scholarships and financial support for continuing their education. HSHS offers leadership development tracks for emerging leaders, new leaders, and executive leaders. Each track has a specific training program customized to help that leader grow to the next stage in their career. One local example of this is Mike Janis, Executive Director of Professional Services at HSHS St. Anthony's Memorial Hospital.

Mike began his career as a certified nurse assistant (CNA) in 2003. During his time as a CNA, he was awarded a scholarship from HSHS to pursue a radiology degree. Two years later, he completed his associate degree in radiology and began as a radiology tech. He then received another HSHS scholarship and advanced to working in nuclear medicine upon completion of his nuclear medicine degree in 2007. Since then, Mike has used the HSHS tuition assistance program to complete his Bachelor of Science in healthcare management and his master's in business administration. During this time, his career was propelled into leadership, landing him where he is today. He is currently completing the HSHS executive leadership track and is working to become a Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives® (FACHE), which is a prestigious national professional certification for health care executives.




