On February 15, 1831, an act of the Illinois Legislature named territory in Fayette County as being named Effingham County. This act appointed the very first County Board members referenced

as Commissioners John Haley, James Galloway, and John Hall to locate the seat of justice for Effingham County. The act specified these commissioners were to make this decision "with an eye to the best interests of said counties".

Ballard Nature Center Offers Fun-Filled Summer Activities for All Ages!

Summer is as busy at the Ballard Nature Center as you might expect. Visit us during the week and you might observe a group of children attending a summer camp with nets in their hands marching to a pond to learn about things that live in the water. Inside our visitor center, you might see a family looking at the displays while escaping the heat after a hike on Bluestem Trail. On a weekend,



you may see a group celebrating a birthday with a potluck in one of the pavilions. One evening, you might see volunteers with telescopes having a star-gazing party for visitors.



Alongside all the people enjoying the Ballard Nature Center, plants and animals are living life. There's a good chance you will see squirrels and rabbits along the trails. The purple martins make their presence known with raucous calls as they fly around the buildings and over the water

catching insects to feed their young in the nest structures we provide. A quiet hiker may be lucky enough to see a bobcat dart across the trail. The prairie truly shines in riotous color all summer. It's a great place to learn to identify some of the plants, or simply enjoy the butterflies that are busy in the flowers.

The Ballard Nature Center offers a variety of programs for people of all ages throughout the

year. Schools and home school groups from several counties visit for programs during the school year. Nearly 1000 children visited this past April and May. Our summer day camps are popular and fill quickly. This year over 100 families are participating.



From the beginning, we have made accessibility a goal. The visitor center is accessible, along with the trail around the wetlands and Leo's Perch, the observation platform in the wetlands. You will find accessible picnic tables and new accessible outdoor restrooms. Both docks on the Kid's Fishing Pond are accessible, with a concrete trail to each.



We offer a safe place to be outdoors, to get away from stress, and to relax with friends and family. Being outdoors is good for mental health, and the evidence for this grows every year. The Ballard Nature Center adds to the quality of life in our community. If you'd like to join

our efforts, we are always looking for volunteers. We are a volunteer-led organization.

Childcare Update for Effingham County

How many times recently have you heard someone asking where to find childcare?

Whether it is care for an anticipated new infant or after school care for a first grader, there's a good chance that you've heard a conversation about the lack of childcare or you've initiated one yourself.

Childcare, more and more of us are learning, is truly the "workforce behind the workforce" and crucial for continued economic growth in Effingham County.

Over the past five months, Effingham County Childcare Research Committee with support from Illinois Action for Children teamed up with EduDream, a Latina-founded, woman-owned, education research consulting firm to perform a childcare feasibility study for Effingham County.

The primary objectives of this project were to (1) determine the current availability of childcare services in Effingham County as well as past patterns and (2) gauge any potential gaps in the county's present and future landscape.

Effingham County's population includes 2,648 children ages 5 and under, or 7.66% of the county's total population. While the overall child population has held steady at about 2,600 over the last 10 years, the number of children age birth to 2 has increased by 10.5% since 2018.

The results were concerning.

First, as most employers may be aware, childcare capacity across the county has fluctuated since 2012 when it was at its highest. Over the past ten years, though, licensed family home care has decreased by more than 50%. And, although more childcare centers have opened over the past ten years, slots there haven't been able to keep pace with the need.

By FY2021, Effingham County only had 44 childcare slots per 100 children.

EduDream's report further revealed that there is a large population of future children who will need childcare for their parents or guardians to participate in Effingham County's workforce. EduDream's most conservative estimate places the need for additional childcare slots at 723 over the next five years.




EduDream's research also revealed an interesting trend in Effingham County's workforce. The percentage of women working in Effingham County's workforce – especially those with children under 6 – has been falling since 2015. This is while women in surrounding counties – even those with children under 6 – have been participating in the workforce at rates of over 80%.

Clearly, there are many reasons why women in this age group are choosing not to be part of the workforce, but it's worth noting that the lack of childcare availability and options may be one of the reasons for the quiet, but noticeable exodus of women with children under the age of 6 from Effingham County's workforce. Because women with children under 6 are missing from the workforce, it's understandable that one of Effingham County's top industries Healthcare and Social Assistance will continue to feel the pinch of a very labor tight market (U.S. Bureau of Labor of Statistics (2022, March 7). You can learn more about Effingham County's future need for childcare from the Informational Community Webinar hosted by EduDream and Effingham Regional Growth Alliance or by accessing the Fact Sheet made available by EduDream.

Increasing childcare infrastructure on the scale that Effingham County needs will require the collaboration of stakeholders from across the County, but thanks to work by the Effingham County Childcare Research Committee three programs, each addressing a separate aspect of childcare, have been launched to meet the need.

First, in an effort to address childcare employee retention, the Childcare Research Committee worked with the Effingham County Board to implement a one-time "thank you" stipend for childcare providers who had been working for more than 6 months.

Second, to increase childcare capacity, in-home family childcare providers and childcare center directors were offered the opportunity to take a course to strengthen their business and then apply for matching grant funds of up to \$5,000 to implement targeted improvements.

The Effingham County Board also took the Childcare Research Committee's recommendation to build capacity in Dieterich's childcare desert by directing \$100,000 of the \$400,000 childcare earmark to Dieterich's Wright Family Center and its child care component.

Finally, the Childcare Research Committee realized that the cost of childcare can sometimes outweigh the financial incentive for working. To help encourage and possibly bring more people into the workforce, Effingham County also launched a Childcare Scholarship for Effingham County residents who don't qualify for Child Care Assistance Program offered by the state of Illinois but live, work and have childcare in Effingham County.

These eligible families have household incomes that are within 25% above the current Illinois' Child Care Assistance Program.

Effingham County Board Member and Effingham County Childcare Research Committee Members, Norbert Soltwedel explained the purpose of the program: "The Effingham County Childcare Scholarship effort is targeted to support what is arguably one of our most vulnerable workforces. We recognize that Effingham County needs to retain these workers and that stabilizing their childcare by providing financial support will help. It's also our hope that this program would encourage those desiring to enter the workforce but currently prevented from doing so due to their income."

"Finding a way to provide more safe, quality childcare is a priority for Effingham County," Effingham County Childcare Research Committee Chairman, Courtney Yockey summarized. "But just knowing that there is a need isn't enough to solve the challenge. We need community members from across Effingham County to be willing to share ideas and help build more capacity for our community."




