



This direct and collaborative approach ensures that the funds raised go directly to where they are needed most, with no overhead or administrative fees. The results are tangible and immediate, providing critical support to local non profits that may otherwise struggle to secure





necessary resources.

"100 Women Who Care" is not just about financial contributions; it's also about fostering a sense of community and empowerment among its members. Women from all walks of life join the organization, forging meaningful connections while collectively making a difference. Their impact ripples through Effingham, touching the lives of countless individuals and families.




