
















Welcoming Our New Chief Administrative Officer

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Dieterich:

The Village of Dieterich recently completed the Safe Routes to School grant sidewalk project and is nearing the final stages of the East Section Street storm sewer project. Additionally, a new roof is currently being installed on Village Hall, marking another step forward in community improvements.

Effingham:

Fayette Reconstruction is underway, with work continuing on the north side of Fayette through Spring 2025.

Completion is expected by Summer 2025.







A ribbon cutting was held on October 30, 2024, to celebrate the completion of the \$2.24 million
Thies Avenue, Airport Road, and Schutzbach Street improvement project. This effort was made possible through a partnership between the City of Effingham, Effingham County, John Boos & Co., and Hetzel Overland Transport. Funding came primarily from state grants, including \$1.46 million from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity's Rebuild Illinois program and \$770,000 from the Illinois Department of Transportation's Truck Access Route Program and Economic Development Program. These grants were awarded based on commitments from John Boos and Hetzel Trucking to add and retain jobs in the area.

Completed by A & R Mechanical from Urbana, Illinois, and designed by Milano & Grunloh, the project included a 1,250-foot extension on Thies Avenue and Schutzbach Street with new sanitary sewer, water main, storm sewer, curb and gutter, sidewalk, and concrete street. Additionally, Airport Road saw 1,100 feet of improvements, upgrading oil and chip surfacing to a concrete street with storm sewer, curb, and gutter installations

Ford Avenue Phase II is set to begin construction this winter, adding 600 feet of street, curbs, gutters, a 10-foot bike path, and streetlights.


