The community is invited to join Lake Land for a special event to celebrate the launch of the newly remodeled Effingham Technology Center. Beginning at 3 p.m., the family-friendly celebration will allow guests to explore the building, view demonstrations in the cutting-edge labs, experience hands-on activities with mobile simulators, enjoy food trucks and even get an up-close look at Lake Land's race car, Volt and other high-tech gadgets!

With the opening of the newly remodeled 100,000-square-foot Effingham Technology Center, Lake Land is strengthening its decades-long presence in the Effingham community to expand local educational opportunities for people

Downtown Effingham is set to come alive on Friday, July 18, as EffingHAM-JAM celebrates its 10th anniversary—a milestone year for one of the area's most anticipated summer events. What began as a small gathering has grown into a full-scale community celebration, drawing thousands of attendees with live music, barbecue, kids' activities, and local vendors—all while raising funds to support education in Effingham County.

This year's event, presented by Koerner Distributor, Inc., promises to be bigger and better than ever. Country music fans won't want to miss **Thomas Mac**, a viral sensation and rising country star, headlining the stage from 7:00 to 10:30 p.m. Mac, who previously performed at the Rusty Reel Lake Jam, left such a strong impression on the community that he's making his return for the main stage this summer. Opening the show will be The Troubadours, a talented local band known for their high-energy performances and crowd favorites—setting the stage for a full night of great live music.

The Hometown Throwdown BBQ Competition is a crowd favorite for good reason. Teams set up early in the morning and spend the day prepping, seasoning, and slow-cooking their entries—turning downtown into a smoky, mouthwatering hub of friendly competition. It's more than just a contest; it's a full day of camaraderie, skill, and passion for barbecue as teams compete for cash prizes, custom trophies, and serious bragging rights. Categories include pork butt, turkey breast, wings (judges only), and side dishes. Community members are invited to sample the entries while supplies last and get in on the action.





The event also features:

- Kids' Activities including Wild Foam Adventures Foam Party, tractor train rides, bubbles, chalk art, and face painting*
- A live skateboarding demo by Deano Tull and the HAM CITY JAM crew
- A diverse lineup of food and drink vendors including: All American Grill, Blaze & Glaze Pizza Co., Crazy 8's BBQ, Gate to Plate, Mac Daddy, The Fair Lady, Krazy Sweet Treats, The Lemonade Stand, Toppins, and Koerner's famous beer tent



Proceeds from EffingHAM-JAM directly support the Effingham County Chamber Community Scholarship Program, which provides







\$1,000 scholarships to local high school seniors and adult learners pursuing post-secondary education.

To ensure the long-term sustainability of this initiative, the Chamber made a strategic change in 2024 by retiring the Chamber Foundation and transitioning management of the scholarship fund to the Southeastern Illinois Community Foundation.

Since the program's inception in 1996, it has awarded \$264,000 to 226 recipients, helping students across Effingham County take the next step in their education.

2025 Membership Survey Results

We recently wrapped up our Membership Survey, and the Membership Development Committee carefully reviewed the responses.

Shredding Program

The Chamber has partnered with Affordable Shred to provide safe, secure document shredding for both businesses and residents.

Here's how it works:

- Documents are weighed, and a small fee of \$0.50 per pound is charged.
- Once containers are full, Affordable Shred will come by to complete the shredding.
- Documents can be dropped off during office hours:
 - Monday Friday, 8 a.m. 4 p.m.
 - Closed on holidays

We recommend calling (217) 342-4147 to confirm the office is open before dropping off.





Recycling Program Update

For over 10 years, we have offered a Recycling Program for printer cartridges. Each year, the list of qualifying cartridges changed on a quarterly basis. For more than five years, Debi Probst and her students from Altamont Schools generously volunteered to pick up cartridges, check them against the eligibility list, pack them, and send them off for recycling.

Unfortunately, we've seen more cartridges being thrown away rather than recycled, making the program unsustainable. As a result, the Effingham County Chamber has decided to discontinue accepting printer cartridges.

Ford Avenue Extension

Construction is underway on a 600-foot extension of Ford Avenue. The project includes two travel lanes, a center turn lane, sidewalk, bike trail, and street lighting to improve safety and connectivity.

Santa Maria Avenue Extension

The extension project from Maple Street to 4th Street has been awarded to Feutz Contractors and is expected to begin this summer. It will feature two travel lanes, curb and gutter, storm sewer, sidewalk, bike trail, and street lighting. Additionally, a new pond with a walking path will be constructed just north of the Richard E. Workman Sports & Wellness Complex.

Sanitary Sewer Improvements

The City recently completed a \$500,000 DCEO grant-funded sanitary sewer lining project. Construction is now underway on a second, larger phase funded by a \$1.5 million DCEO grant to continue improving sewer infrastructure citywide.

RISE Implementation Grant

The City has been awarded \$373,500 through the DCEO RISE Implementation Grant Program. Funds will be used to acquire 2.65 acres along Heritage Avenue, which will be improved with storm sewer infrastructure and subdivided for up to 17 new single-family homes.

Effingham Performance Center Parking Lot Expansion

Construction is progressing on the EPC parking lot expansion along Outer Belt West. The project will add 100 new parking spaces, enhanced lighting, pedestrian improvements, and an additional entrance for better traffic flow.

Annual Maintenance Projects

Several regular maintenance initiatives have been awarded and are set to begin in the coming weeks, including:

- Street Resurfacing: Circle Drive, Temple Avenue (from Willow to N. Ealy Street), Mini Hills Drive, Lustig Lane, and Steger Drive
- Sidewalk Replacement: Various locations citywide
- Oil & Chip Program: Citywide
- Crack Sealing Program: Citywide
- Concrete Pavement Patching: Citywide

Downtown Mural Project

A new mural sponsored by HSHS St. Anthony's Memorial Hospital is currently under construction by StangARTs on the east wall of 105 Jefferson Avenue in Downtown Effingham.





IDOT Fayette Avenue Project

The long-anticipated IDOT improvements to Fayette Avenue are nearing completion, with final work expected to wrap up by July 31, 2025.

Residential Growth & Enterprise Zone Impact

The City's residential Enterprise Zone incentives have contributed to the construction of five new single-family homes and a 17-unit apartment building in Effingham during 2025 alone.

Commercial Developments

- A1 Liquors is currently under construction on a new building in Downtown Effingham.
- Gabby Goat American Pub & Grill is preparing to open the doors to their new facility this summer.
- Sarah Bush Lincoln is slated to begin construction later this summer on the SBL Effingham Specialty Pavilion, a new two-story, 39,946 sq ft medical office building located across from the SBL Effingham Clinic at 905 N. Maple St. The facility is projected to open near the end of 2026.
